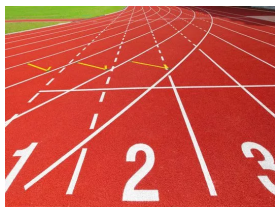


Northville sweeps Stevenson in Central dual

Clare McNamara and Barbara Davis each captured two individual events leading Northville to a convincing 116-21 KLAA Central Division girls track and field victory on April 18 over visiting Livonia Stevenson.

McNamara took the long jump (17 feet, 2.25 inches) and 200-meter dash (26.44), while Davis swept the shot put (31-9) and discus (100-6).

Other first-place finishers for the Mustangs, who improved to 2-0 in the KLAA Central, included: Erin McCallum, 100 (12.9); Yasmine Affes, 400 (1:00.61); Cayla Eckenroth, 800 (2:22.53); Ana Barrott, 1,600 (5:17.58); Emily Assemany, 3,200 (11:41.21); Lauren Lambert, high jump (4-10); and Daryn Lobingier, pole

vault (9-6).

Northville also captured all four relay races led by Lobingier, Rachel Robitaille, Ellie Cotter and Skyler Peppo in the 4 x 100 (53.16). The foursome of Manley, Maddie Dragon, Disha Satapathy and Elan Jomaa took the 800 relay (1:47.46), while Emilie Chen, Lily Oles, Claire Wan and Affes finished first in the 1,600 relay (4:33.39).

The Mustangs' 3,200 relay team of Emma Smith, Emily Rudberg, Eckenroth and Barrott was also victorious (10:06.57).

"I was really happy to see Emily Assemany hit the additional qualifier for the regional meet in the 3,200," Dalton said. "Clare (McNamara) also continues to be very special for us both on the track and in long jump.

The loss dropped Stevenson to 1-1 in the KLAA Central.

Meanwhile, the Northville boys came away with 78-59 win over the Spartans getting individual firsts from Ja'Quan Crawford, discus (120-3); Caleb Sheehan, long jump (19-4.5); Ben Stuart, 110 hurdles (1:17.22); Nicholas Couyoumjian, 1,600 (4:37.05); and Ben Cracraft, 3,200 (9:53.33).

Northville also captured the 400 relay as Andrew Hezemy, Malik Abbasi, Eric Robertson and Andrew Fillman were clocked in 47.55. The foursome of Connor Bragg, Daniel McLaughlin, Nolan Knight and Rohan Brand won the 800 relay (1:38.82).

Northville's 3,200 relay team of Cracraft, Reed Knechtges, Evan Ferrante and Jack Scavnicky also captured the 3,200 relay (8:29.95).

Both teams stand 1-1 in the KLAA Central Division.

"We knew it would be close on the boys side," Dalton said. "We had a couple relays go our way and that made the difference. It is a credit to our kids understanding that each point matters. We scored some very needed points in the field and Peter Bejin hit the additional regional qualifier in the 3,200 running 9:57.96 (for third place)."

Rocket Invitational

On April 14, the Northville girls took runner-up honors in the Rocket Invitational Green Division at Muskegon Reeths-Puffer after being edged by Hudsonville, 127-5-126.

Host Reeths-Puffer beat Hudsonville for the boys title, 124-95, while Northville was fifth with 52.

"We had some solid performances," Dalton said. "I was really happy with the way our 4 x 8's came out and competed to get the meet started. It was a great opportunity to get to the other side of the state and see some competition in both Division 1 and Division 2 that we do not normally see."
