Mustangs run wild over Chiefs

Northville girls begin dual meet season with impressive victory

(Northville, Mich.) The Northville girls track and field team kicked off the 2019 campaign on a high note as the host Mustangs (1-0) defeated Canton (0-1) 114-17 in a KLAA West Division dual meet.

The Mustangs took first place in 15 of the 17 events contested.

The individual winners for Northville included Abby Dunn, 100-meter hurdles (17.57) and 300 hurdles (49.69); Delaney Hopkins, shot put (32 feet, 3 ½ inches); Angel McCray, high jump (4-8); Lora Haupt, pole vault (8-6); Claire Wan, long jump (16-3); Melanie Sarafian, 100 (12.83) and 200 (27.76); Isabella Blomberg, 400 (1:06.03); Emily Gordon, 800 (2:30.50); and Yasmine Mansi, 1600 (5:23.24).

Northville's 400 (51.50), 800 (2:06.50), 1,600 (4:23.46), and 3,200 (10:02.47) relays also won.

The Chiefs got individual victories from Morgan Dodds in the discus (107-06) and Anna Nagelhout in the 3,200-meter run (11:56.73).

Northville boys begin season on high note

The boys team also defeated Canton, 94-43 on Tuesday. Northville (1-0) dominated the running events, winning nine of the 13 events.

Individual first place finishers for the Mustangs included Brandon Kearney, 100 (11.52); Demetri Zervos, 200 (23.97); Nicholas Couyoumjian, 1,600 (4:47.59); Alex Flegal, 3,200 (10:08.27); Jacob Pichler, 100-meter hurdles (16.75); 400 relay (44.33); 800 relay (1:34.01); 1,600 relay (3:33.97); and 3,200 relay (8:22.10).

Srikar Komanduri, 400 (52.78), Alex Poe, 800 (2:11.40), and Donovan King, 300-meter hurdles (42.24) were victorious on the track for Canton (0-1).

The Chiefs fared better in the field events, taking first in three of the five events contested. Christopher Knight (5 feet, 10 inches) led a near sweep in the high jump for Canton, and Evan Carter won both the pole vault (13-07) and the long jump (20 feet, 6 ½ inches).

Demir Tagani took first in the shot put with a toss of 42 feet, 7 inches and Eddie Lim won the discus with a throw of 109 feet, 5 ½ inches for Northville.

The track and field teams travel to Rockford, Mich. this weekend for the Rockford Invitational on Saturday and then to Hartland next Tuesday for their second KLAA dual meet of this season.
