Boys track and field wins again

The Northville boys track and field team improved to 2-0 on the season with a 74-62 victory over the Hartland Eagles on Tuesday.

Northville senior Ben Shuart led the way for the Mustangs with victories in both the 110 and 300 meter hurdles. “We are a very talented team this year,” Coach Tim Dalton said. “We must continue to stay focused and working hard each day to get better.”

The Mustangs won all four relay events and earned first place finishes from Demetri Zervos (200), Nolan Knight (400), and Nick Couyoumjian (800).

In the field, Zach Helner had a career best performance in the high jump as he cleared the bar set at 5 feet, 6 inches. Connor Gallagher and Eddie Lim both set personal records in the discus.

Northville hosts Howell next Tuesday in their second home dual meet of the season.

Girls track and field remains undefeated

The Northville girls track and field team continued their winning ways as the Mustangs defeated the Hartland 83-54 in a KLAA West Division dual meet on Tuesday.

Northville senior Melanie Sarafian won both the 100 and 200 meter dashes. “I was happy overall with the way we competed. We have some things we need to clean up as a group. We will get back to work at practice and be hitting on all cylinders come May and June,” Dalton said.

The Mustangs overpowered Hartland on the track, with first place finishes from Emily Gordon (800), Olivia Harp (1600), Kayleigh Line (3200), and Abby Dunn (300 hurdles) in addition to Sarafian’s. Northville also won all four relays.

The Eagles fared better in the field events as they swept the long jump and outscored the the Mustangs 34-11 in those five events. Lora Haupt won the pole vault with a leap of 8 feet, 6 inches.

Northville moved to 2-0 on the season as Hartland dropped to 0-2.
