Girls track

NORTHVILLE 125, STEVENSON 12: Sophomore Clare McNamara broke her own school record in the long jump (18 feet, 4¼) and set a new stadium record in the 200-meter dash (25.47) on May 1 as the host Mustangs (5-0) defeated Livonia Stevenson (1-4) in a KLAA Gold Division dual meet.

McNamara topped the stadium mark in the 200 by former Mustang Chloe Abbott, who went on to earn NCAA All-American indoor honor at Purdue. She also won the high jump (4-9).

"I would've guessed all of Chloe's records would be up on the record board for a long, long time, so taking that one down is really special for Clare," Northville coach Tim Dalton said. "Chloe was a once-in-a-lifetime athlete for us. We are just lucky and fortunate to have Clare so soon after Chloe graduated."

Other track records to fall included the 800 relay of McNamara, Savannah Manley, Erin McCallum and Yasmine Affes (1:44.56), along with the 400 relay of Claire Wan, Melanie Sarafian, Lauren Marshall and McCallum (49.48).

Other Northville firsts were garnered by Abby Dunn, 110 hurdles (17.03) and 300 hurdles (49.46); Lauren Marshall, 100 (12.92); Affes, 400 (1:00.45); Yasmine Mansi, 800 (2:24.16); Olivia Harp, 1,600 (5:16.6); Ana Barrott, 3,200 (11:39.59); Sarah Ismail, shot put (34-10); Delaney Hopkins, discus (94-5); and Elise Daniel, pole vault (9-9).

The Mustangs' 1,600 relay team of Dunn, Wan, Manley and Affes took first (4:18.48) as did the 3,200 relay team of Barrott, Emily Gordon, Harp and Mansi (9:51.87).

"It's really special to see our relay teams work together towards a common goal," Dalton said. "These kids depend on one another, support each other; they don't want to let their teammates down. Their teamwork and accountability is what makes them great teammates and leaders."

SALEM 89, CANTON 48: Haven Essien swept the 100- and 300-meter hurdles in 16.01 and 50.27, respectively, as the Rocks (5-0) gained a share of the KLAA Black Division and Bolger-Mangan title on May 1 by defeating the Chiefs at Plymouth-Canton Educational Park.

Essien was also runner-up in the 200 (27.02), while other individual winners included Lyniah Wilson, shot put (37 feet, 1½ inches), Jenna Sydlowski, discus (31-8½); Makayla Ward, high jump (4-10); Julia Devine, long jump (14-9½); Olivia Millen, 1,600 (5:27.72); and Elizabeth MacLellen, 3,200 (13:36.6).

Salem also won three relays as Devine, Autumn Smith, Alex Szegi and Madeline Kernahan captured the 4 x 100 (52.12), while the quartet of Smith, Marihon Westley, Szegi and Kernahan took the 4 x 200 (1:48.78). The 4 x 800 foursome of Abby Marthaler, Kubinski, Marnie Waggoner and Reagan Justice also placed first (10:54.83).

Canton's Jada Sabir swept the 100-, 200- and 400 in 13.05, 26.48 and 1:01.38, respectively. She also teamed up with Carmen Bruchnak, Victoria Faber and Asmita Tuladhar for a first in the 4 x 400 (4:11.08).

Other first-place finishers for the Chiefs included Bruchnak in the 800 (2:24.00) and Victoria Faber in the pole vault (11-8).

Boys track

NORTHVILLE 76½, STEVENSON 66½: Junior Brandon Kearney set a new stadium record on May 1 in the 200-meter dash (22.12) as the host Mustangs (3-2) downed Livonia Stevenson in a KLAA Black Division dual meet.

Kearney broke the record held since 2001 by former Northville sprint coach Brandon Langston. He also was the anchor leg teaming up with Zack Phillips, Trevor Kelterborn and Brennen Van Riper for a Northville home track mark in the 4 x 100 relay (set in 2014 by Salem) with a time of 44.63.

"Brandon is such a competitor," Dalton said. "He also anchored our 4 x 400 team and they also were trying to get their names on the record board. Brandon was really disappointed when they fell just short. (by 8 hundredths of a second) His name is going up there, but he wanted his teammates names up alongside him as well. He cares about his teammates, does what is asked of him, and never questions or complains about anything. He's a terrific young man."

Nick Couyoumjian also won the 800 in a stadium record 1:54.97 (set in 2011). He also teamed up with Mike Gruianu, Nolan Knight and Kearney for a time of 3:30.69 in the 1,600 relay. The 3,200 relay team of Couyoumijian, Alex Beloiu, Alex Jund and Raymond Jiang were also victorious (8:23.93).

Other Northville individual winners included Ja'Quan Crawford, shot put (46 feet, 2¾) and discus (113-9); Jackson Frederick, high jump (5-6); Ben Shuart, long jump (19-7); Kelterborn, 100 (11.37); and Knight, 400

(53.28).

Jake Kaupp led Stevenson with firsts in the 110 hurdles (15.73); 300 hurdles (42.09) followed by Ben Griffith, 1,600 (4:43.25); Owen Rowader, 3,200 (10:28.45); Collin Bowersox, pole vault (12-6).

The Spartans' 800 relay team of Jacob Reyna, Nick Lamothe, C.J. Krzyca and Caden Woodall also took first in 1:36.57.

SALEM 88, CANTON 49: Andrew Davis swept the 100- and 200-meter dashes in 11.31 and 22.61, respectively, and figured in four first-place finishes as the Rocks (5-0) clinched a share of the KLAA Black Division title and Mangan-Bolger title May 1 at Plymouth-Canton Educational Park.

Davis also teamed up with Jason Warras, Julius Nelson and Ryan Young for a first in the 400 relay (43.18). He also teamed up with John Paul DeLa Cruz, Younger and Sharriff Dyer for a victory in the 800 relay (1:30.92).

Other Salem individual winners included Dyer, 110 hurdles (15.63) and 300 hurdles (39.57); Alex Howie, shot put (47 feet, 3 inches); Hezekiah Williams, 800 (1:59.71); Ryan Exell, 1,600 (4:36.59); and Talha Syed, 3,200 (10:28.79).

Salem's 1,600 relay team of Michael Schroeder, Josh Pohl, Williams and Berry Matthews took first (3:31.40), while the foursome of Andrew Beyer, Schroeder, Pohl and Matthews took the 3,200 relay (8:59.84).

Chuck Carey led Canton with firsts in the high jump (5-8) and pole vault (13-0). Other firsts came from James Deese (discus, 145-6), Caden Domzalski (long jump, 20-10½) and Dirk Thornhill (400, 51.35).

NORTHVILLE 5, CHURCHILL 4: Tyler Troyer went 2-for-4, including the game-winning RBI single in the top of the seventh on April 30 to give the Mustangs (13-5, 9-4) the KLAA crossover victory at Livonia Churchill (10-10).

The Mustangs completed the sweep in the nightcap, 14-2, as Tyler Troyer went 2-for-3 with three RBI, while Billy Flohr was 2-for-2 with two RBIs. Nick Broda also knocked in two runs.

"Against Groves we had a great day all around," said Northville coach John Kostrzewa said. "Offense, defense, and pitching were great. We hope to continue to build on this week and keep getting better."
